Telling Nature's Stories

Nature has many stories to tell us, but we are often too busy or too preoccupied to hear her stories. Sometimes we just don't remember how to listen to Nature. Springbrook Nature Center provides us opportunities to hear Nature's stories. We can hear them when we take a walk, or sit along the trail and observe. Over time we note the changes with the seasons, hear the birds singing as they sit perched in their nests, see the bees and other insects working to pollinate flowers, and hear the wind rustling the leaves of the large cottonwood trees. The staff at Springbrook help us interpret what we see and hear with programs for children and adults; from playful polliwogs to Friday Night by Firelight to Discovery Dinners. As we learn to listen to Nature's stories, we begin to hear Nature in our daily lives, and start gathering our own stories of Nature to tell. Here's one of many Nature's stories experienced at Springbrook:

"I grew up in the Fridley area, I've been coming to Springbrook Nature Center for most of my life. When my wife and I had kids, we started looking for places outside to have fun as a family. We decided to check out a bird banding event at Springbrook. Then we started following SNC on social media. We found more fundraising and nature events for our children to enjoy. Before we knew it, our family found ourselves ingrained in SNC. My wife is now on the SNC Foundation Board and our kids love coming here. We are devoted to supporting SNC events for our family and for future families."

Your generous support of Springbrook Nature Center ensures that we will be able to hear and experience Nature's stories for years to come.

The Springbrook Nature Center Foundation used 2019 to foster a greater sense of community in Fridley and the broader North Suburban area. We have seen increased visitation as the Springbrook Nature Center developed new programming, updated exhibits, and increased facility rentals. The expert staff, talented volunteers, and many donors continue to make these programs and events possible. Highlighted events in 2019 include: Saturday in the Park, Pumpkin Night, the Springbrook Spree, the Autumn Sampler, and the Summer Entertainment Series.



The last major component of the SPRING (Sanctuary Protection and Renewal Into the Next Generation) Project—the Pavilion Activity Center—is scheduled for completion in early 2020. This new Pavilion Activity Center will provide an additional community resource for science education, community celebrations, relaxing picnics, and gathering Nature's stories.

Our goal for the SPRING Project was to focus on development and enhancement of the 7-acre entrance area to accommodate expanded educational and community use while protecting the remainder of the 127-acre Nature Center from overuse and negative impact. We are achieving that goal. As the SPRING Project wraps up, we continue to offer expressions of memory, tribute, and commemoration with pavers, benches, trees, and picnic tables for those who want a lasting memory at Springbrook.

The educational programs and maintenance of the Nature Center would not be possible without the skills and knowledge of our talented staff and the donation of time and talents from volunteers. Our staff provided over 535 educational programs in 2019. Our 1,300 community volunteers and 17 Board members provided 8,448 hours of donated time.

Come and visit! Become a volunteer, participate in an educational program, or just walk the trails and relax in nature. Thank you for making 2019 another banner year for Nature's stories.

LISTENING TO NATURE'S STORIES

Springbrook patrons and supporters have enjoyed Nature's stories for years, sharing them with friends, families, and loved ones. To celebrate Springbrook, the SPRING Project, and our community, we wish to share some of those stories.



Our first story comes from Jill Genaw and how she was introduced to Springbrook Nature Center through birdbanding.

"My introduction to Springbrook Nature Center was a notice in the daily paper inviting the public to participate in the SNC bird banding program. I just watched and marveled at these tiny creatures.

Eventually, I got to hold one in my hand. The minute I felt that tiny heart beating as I set it free was magical. I WAS HOOKED! After 12 years on the banding crew, I'm still learning and having fun every week. I now enjoy watching new visitors, especially children, release their first bird and get hooked as I did."

Our second story comes from Friends of the Springbrook Nature Center Foundation. Steve and Mary won the bird banding basket in the auction at our 2019 Spring Spree. Their grandson recently developed an interest in bird watching, and they couldn't wait to bring him to Springbrook.

"We saw the whole process from capture to release. Experts identified birds by species, recorded their weights, categorized sex and age, and noted any unusual characteristics. After banding, the kids stepped outside and were shown how to hold and release the bird. We can't begin to tell you what a thrill this was for our grandson and his two younger brothers. Thanks to Springbrook, our family was introduced to the world of bird banding and developed an increased appreciation for nature."

With the completion of the SPRING Project, we will be listening to Nature's stories, new and old, for generations. We invite you to stop by Springbrook Nature Center to experience and share your own story.

¹Springbrook Nature Center Foundation is a 501 (C)(3) tax exempt non-profit organization separate from the City of Fridley. Its mission is to protect and enhance the Nature Center. However, different from most non-profit organizations, the City of Fridley owns and operates the Nature Center while the Springbrook Nature Center Foundation advises the City and raises funds for additional programming, capital enhancements and other program supports. The above unaudited financial statement does not include personnel and other general operating expenses for the Nature Center. Also, the Springbrook Nature Center Foundation is completing a major capital project to support the enhanced development of the Nature Center. As a result, line items such as SPRING expense may appear high compared to total expense, but are reasonable when a complete picture of the Nature Center operations includes information for both the City of Fridley and the Springbrook Nature Center Foundation. In 2019, tax revenue provided by the City to operate the Nature Center was \$385,224. In addition, the Nature Center's programs and rentals generated earned income of \$269,300. The Nature Center's operating expenses for 2019 were \$622,114. Combined, 2019 Springbrook Nature Center and Springbrook Nature Center Foundation total revenues were \$841,179 and total expenses were \$778,670.
